ICAR JSS Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Mysuru

The KVK is established by the JSS Mahavidyapeetha in Mysuru in 1994. The NGO-managed ICAR KVK is celebrating its Silver Jubilee this year. Known for its innovative initiatives the KVK has pioneered the 'Seed Village Concept', organizes a very unique annual event, Krishimela, in which over 160 different crops are grown just for the occasion and has been implementing a pilot 'Demand-driven Extension Model' viz., JSS Agri Clinic combining the 'Agri Doctor' and 'Agri Pharmacy' through which over 40,000 farmers are provided with diagnostic services as well as quality agricultural inputs.
